11.8 Preparation for the High-Level Meeting
of the General Assembly on Ending Tuberculosis

Honorable Chairperson, Distinguished Delegates,

Thank you for the opportunity to address you today. IOGT International welcomes the first United Nations High-level meeting on Tuberculosis, one day before the UN High-level Meeting on NCDs. Tuberculosis and NCDs have a common, major risk factor: alcohol.

Evidence shows that alcohol use, alcohol dosage and alcohol-related problems are all associated with an increased risk of tuberculosis. In fact, alcohol use increases the risk of TB threefold, and is also a strong risk factor for poor TB treatment adherence.

As for NCDs, alcohol is an important population level risk factor for TB. This shows that a focus on addressing cross-cutting risk factors and co-morbidities, like alcohol and alcohol use disorders, reaps co-benefits across different public health and sustainable development issues.

IOGT International therefore encourages the UN system and Member States to make the most of both high-level meetings, as a unique opportunity to present a 'One Health' approach that demonstrates co-benefit solutions such as alcohol policy best buy interventions, integrating prevention with treatment and rehabilitation services, and addressing the social and commercial determinants of health.
