IOGT International Official Statement RC69 Agenda item 14 Accelerating the Response to NCDs in Line with the Political Declaration of the UNGA HLM on NCDs

Honorable Chairperson, Distinguished Delegates, I thank you for the opportunity to address you on behalf of IOGT International, supported by the East African Alcohol Policy Alliance.

IOGT International commends the Secretariat for the report, the clarity in the challenges outlined and the comprehensive set of actions proposed.

The report paints a gloomy picture. **Not enough is being done, especially in terms of tackling NCDs risk factors, such as alcohol.** Alcohol is a major obstacle to sustainable development, **adversely affecting 13 of 17 SDGs**. Alcohol is a serious – and in many African countries the biggest - NCDs risk factor, fueling cancer, heart, disease, diabetes, and mental ill-health.

We call on you to make the alcohol policy the priority they should be!

Policy solutions and high-impact, cost-effective interventions are at hand. IOGT International would like to emphasize three key elements for the way forward:

- 1. We call on Member States to revive the work on the regional alcohol strategy.
- 2. We are asking for a status report on the implementation of the regional alcohol strategy to be discussed at the RCM70 in 2020. And we are calling for the Framework to implement the regional alcohol strategy to be updated and finally put into action.
- 3. At WHO on all levels, **more staffing with more technical expertise** is absolutely crucial to support Member States in tackling alcohol harm as the priority it should be.
